Getting Promoted from Associate to Full Professor

The presentation focuses on evaluation metrics for each Area of Excellence as well as tips for preparing the annotated list of their 10 Most Significant Scholarly Works and list of suggested reviewers. 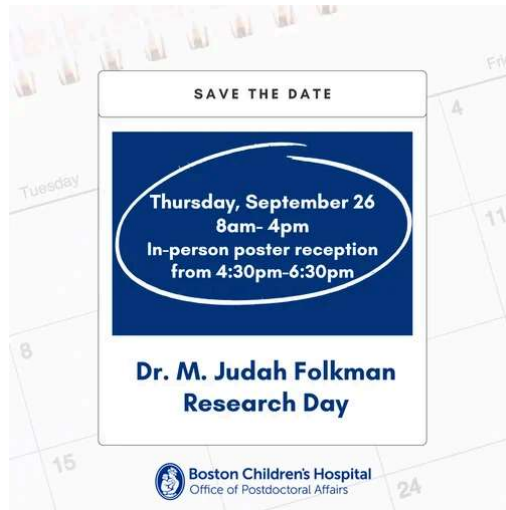

DEADLINES APPROACHING:

**Translational Research Program Awards
Deadline May 6, 2024**

Junior Translational Investigator Service Award

Who: Independent early-career Boston Children's investigators, minimum of 50% of time devoted to translational research. Individuals must be nominated by their department.

What: Funds for 50% effort up to maximum total salary of \$125,000/year (TRP provides additional research support up to \$40,000/yr)

Mentored Translational Investigator Service Award

Who: MD or MD/PhD's who are done with clinical training are eligible. Award is intended for early career investigators at early stage of research career with minimum 50% of time devoted to translational research. Individuals must be nominated by their department.

What: Awards for \$300k/3 years direct cost (TRP will cover overhead charges)

How: Each awardee will be officially paired with a mentor from the pool of current Senior TIS members as well as with a mentor from outside of BCH who is from the local biotech/pharma/venture capital community.

Boston Children's Hospital ICCTR Health Equity Grants
Request for Proposals

Program Description: The Office of Health Equity and Inclusion, in collaboration with the Medical Staff Organization (MSO), the Office of Faculty Development, and the Institutional Centers for Clinical and Translational Research (ICCTR), are announcing two \$15,000 awards funded by the MSO and the Harvard Catalyst.

Purpose: These one-year grants are to support innovative projects aimed at promoting equitable health outcomes and reducing health care inequities in the pediatric population.

Eligibility: BCH faculty who are members of the MSO and at Instructor or Assistant Professor rank as of July 2024 are eligible. While applicants who belong to populations underrepresented in medicine are encouraged to apply, this is not a requirement for funding.

Funding period: July 1, 2024 to June 30, 2025.

Updated Application Deadline: 5/10/24, 12 noon
