#### **Program goals:**

- 1. Establish a multilingual translation and cultural adaptation collaborative to create a library of translated materials
- 2. Provide mentorship for local/national research that advances language equity
- 3. Promote scholarship focused on language equity
- 4. Create training materials for clinicians researchers on language equity best practices
- 5. Conduct language equity-focused research
- 6. Advocate for language equity in research and operations.
