Boston Children's Faculty Parental Wellness Program

We are thrilled to announce the launch of the <u>Parental Wellness Program</u>, designed to <u>promote well-being</u>, <u>build community</u>, and <u>enhance productivity</u> among faculty. This program is sponsored by the Office of Faculty Development and Office for Women's Careers and supported by Boston Children's Health Affairs.

You will find a **one-stop resource library**, available to all, which offers a range of information aimed at ensuring your well-being and success as a parent and a professional. You will find information on navigating parental leave, lactation supports, the Boston Children's Childcare Center, backup childcare options, the Caregiver Travel Award, physician supports, wellness and more. We will be forming groups for faculty with children at every stage as well as for those with elder-care responsibilities.

Part of this initiative is the **Pilot Lactation Program**, led by **Drs. Carly Guss** and **Kelly Wills Adani**. This program is tailored to parent faculty who are currently pregnant or who are the lactating parent of an infant under six months of age. You **do not** need to be a first-time parent to participate. A stipend provides financial support up to \$500 to assist with the costs associated with feeding and lactation needs. Each participant will be paired with an experienced and trained Parental Wellness Advocate, who is also a colleague at Boston Children's, to provide guidance and support.





Getting Promoted from Assistant to Associate Professor Monday, July 22, 2024, 3:30pm to 5:00pm, on Zoom

Description: This 60-minute presentation, followed by a 30-minute Q&A, is a great introduction to the Associate Professor promotion process for faculty members at the rank of Assistant Professor contemplating or preparing for promotion. Topics include selecting an Area of Excellence and Significant Supporting Activities, evaluation criteria, and requirements for the dossier. We encourage attendees to review relevant sections of the Faculty of Medicine handbook and/or Promotion Profile Library before arriving to better facilitate engagement and allow more time to ask questions. HMS Catalyst Training Program: Career Catalyst

September 2024 - June 2025

Applications are due June 28, 2024 by 5:00pm EST.

Career Catalyst is a strategic, one-year mentoring program for early-career researchers. Participants in the program learn how to create a successful menteementor relationship, build a mentoring network, and grow their career.

In this program, mentees are placed in small groups of three to four participants and are matched with a senior faculty member who serves as a developmental mentor. Each mentee group meets together twice per month, once with their assigned senior mentor, and once as a peer group without their senior mentor.

To build a sense of community, three program-wide meetings for all mentees and mentors are hosted throughout the year (September, February, and June).

Sandra L. Fenwick Institute for Pediatric Health Equity and Inclusion 2024 - 2026 Request for Applications

Mission: To be a driving force for the advancement of pediatric health equity and developing inclusive excellence in healthcare and research leadership nationally, and globally to improve health outcomes for all children

Eligibility: All Boston Children's Hospital employees, faculty, and staff including but not limited to: (i) clinical faculty or clinical staff (MD, RN/NP, PA, or any allied health clinical professional discipline); (ii) basic science and other research (nonclinical) faculty; and (iii) administrative or operational professionals. Trainees (residents/fellows) and post-docs are not eligible.

Topic Areas: "Diversity in Pediatric Clinical Research" and "Impact of Climate Change, Resiliency and Sustainability Interventions"

Funding: Each of the awards provides \$50,000/year for 2 years (i.e. \$100,000 per award).

Harvard Catalyst's Clinical and Translational Research Academy First Grant Bootcamp

This intensive 15-week program will support early-stage investigators as they write their first grant application, often an F32, foundation, or professional society grant. Ideal candidates are those who are approaching or just beyond the completion of research fellowship training.

The program will provide self-paced grant-writing instruction, live webinars, and individual feedback and support through faculty-led small groups. By the end of the program, participants will have a strong grant application, informed by program curriculum, as well as faculty and peer feedback.

Applications due before 5:00pm EST on July 25, 2024.

News from the BCH Archives

Bader Building

The six-story Bader Building, formally dedicated on May 22, 1930, was one of the most modern hospital facilities of its time in America. It was named in honor of Constance Bader, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Louis F. S. Stanton Bader who was treated for polio at Children's Hospital and survived.

The Bader building was designed for physiotherapy and neurology. It contained a 20-ft pool specifically created to treat polio patients and gym on the first floor along with numerous physical and occupational therapy rooms on the second and third floors. The fourth and fifth floors were devoted to neurology while the sixth floor was designed for "heliotherapy and artificial light therapy" containing carbon arc and ultraviolet lights. Today, Bader houses hospital offices. For more information, contact the <u>Archives Program</u>.
