

BCH now offers <u>2 courses</u> for faculty to improve leadership skills as Early Career laboratory or clinical researchers.

Laboratory Leadership Course for Lab-based Research Faculty

Sponsors: Boston Children's Research Administration and the OFD Course Director: Carla Kim, PhD - Director, Basic Science Career Development

Eligibility: Faculty who have started their own research lab in the last 5 years **Goal:** Address aspects of running a lab with real-life scenarios and training support ready for implementation. Topics such as leadership skills, personnel management, and preparing for career advancement. Additionally, this series will serve as a networking platform to enhance a sense of community, support, and bidirectional mentorship.

Pilot Boston Children's Clinical Research Leadership Course

Sponsors: Harvard Catalyst/Boston Children's Research Administration Course Directors: Boston Children's Hospital Harvard Catalyst mentors Richard Lee MD (Department of Urology), Maitreyi Mazumdar MD MPH (Department of Neurology), Lise Nigrovic MD MPH (Division of Emergency Medicine), and Greg Sawicki MD MPH (Division of Pulmonology)

Eligibility: early-career clinical research faculty.

Goal: The goal is to cultivate a close-knit, inclusive community of Boston Children's clinical research faculty and to nurture the next generation of clinical researchers. Topics will include leadership skills, personnel management, career advancement, and utilization of a clinical research toolkit. The course structure is curated to optimize engagement and meaningful interactions in order to build community

Up to 12 faculty members will be selected. The course will kick off with a retreat on October 18, 2024.

Harvard Catalyst's Clinical and Translational Research Academy First Grant Bootcamp

Learn more about the skills involved in writing successful research grants:

This intensive 15-week program will support early-stage investigators as they write their first grant application, often an F32, foundation, or professional society grant. Ideal candidates are those who are approaching or just beyond the completion of research fellowship training.

The program will provide self-paced grant-writing instruction, live webinars, and individual feedback and support through faculty-led small groups. By the end of the program, participants will have a strong grant application, informed by program curriculum, as well as faculty and peer feedback.

Boston Children's Faculty Parental Wellness Program

We are thrilled to announce the launch of the <u>Parental Wellness Program</u>, designed to <u>promote well-being</u>, <u>build community</u>, and <u>enhance productivity</u> among faculty. This program is sponsored by the Office of Faculty Development and Office for Women's Careers and supported by Boston Children's Health Affairs.

You will find a **one-stop resource library**, available to all, offers a range of information, including navigating parental leave, lactation supports, the Boston Children's Childcare Center, backup childcare options, the Caregiver Travel Award, physician supports, wellness and more. We will be forming groups for faculty with children at every stage as well as for those with elder-care responsibilities.

Part of this initiative is the **Pilot Lactation Program**, led by **Drs. Carly Guss** and **Kelly Wills Adani**. This program is tailored to parent faculty who are currently pregnant or who are the lactating parent of an infant under six months of age. You **do not** need to be a first-time parent to participate. A stipend provides financial support up to \$500 to assist with the costs associated with feeding and lactation needs. Each participant will be paired with an experienced and trained Parental Wellness Advocate, who is also a colleague at Boston Children's, to provide guidance and support.

Office of Sponsored Programs

The **Office of Sponsored Programs** handles governmental, foundation and other non-profit funding arrangements. Grant officers are assigned to the research community by department and division. They serve as the primary points of contact for grant application review, award acceptance and administration, sponsor relations and inter-institutional administrative arrangements related to governmental, foundation and other non-profit sources of funding. OSP is committed to facilitating and supporting the research mission of the institution.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

Arnold and Mabel Beckman Foundation - Young Investigator Award

Mission: Program provides support to early career faculty conducting innovative, high-risk research in the chemical and life sciences, particularly to foster the invention of methods, instruments and materials that will enable novel scientific research.

Eligibility: Applicants MUST be (1) within the first four years of a tenure-track position, (2) have no more than 10 years post terminal degree and no more than five years of experience in a non-tenure track (not including postdoc position), and (3) have no more than \$225,000 in direct, annualized external funding at time of application.

Funding: \$600,000 over four years. No indirect costs are allowed.

Deadline: Letters of intent are due **August 1**, **2024**. If invited, full applications are due January 13, 2025.

Sandra L. Fenwick Institute for Pediatric Health Equity and Inclusion 2024 - 2026 Request for Applications

Mission: To be a driving force for the advancement of pediatric health equity and developing inclusive excellence in healthcare and research leadership nationally, and globally to improve health outcomes for all children

Eligibility: All Boston Children's Hospital employees, faculty, and staff including but not limited to: (i) clinical faculty or clinical staff (MD, RN/NP, PA, or any allied health clinical professional discipline); (ii) basic science and other research (nonclinical) faculty; and (iii) administrative or operational professionals. Trainees (residents/fellows) and post-docs are not eligible.

Topic Areas: "Diversity in Pediatric Clinical Research" and "Impact of Climate Change, Resiliency and Sustainability Interventions"

Funding: Each of the awards provides \$50,000/year for 2 years (i.e. \$100,000 per award).


